Lesson Text: Matthew 12:38-41; 28:1-10 Memory Selection: Matthew 12:40


38. Then certain of the scribes and of the Pharisees answered, saying, Master, we would see a sign from thee.

39. But he answered and said unto them, An evil and adulterous generation seeketh after a sign; and there shall no sign be given to it, but the sign of the prophet Jonas:

40. For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.

41. The men of Nineveh shall rise in judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it: because they repented at the preaching of Jonas; and, behold, a greater than Jonas is here.

GARDEN TOMB

The Garden Tomb is reached by a lane, north of Damascus Gate. The property was acquired in 1894, when a Society was formed "For the preservation of the Tomb and Garden outside the walls of Jerusalem, be-lieved by many people to be the Sepulchre and Garden of Joseph of Arimathea". The garden lies on the west side of the prominent hill just outside the city wall, at the foot of the rocky knoll, the south and west side of which are steep. The rock-cut Tomb, first discovered in 1867 but not excavated until 1891, dates from the Roman period and is thought to have been the Tomb belonging to Joseph of Arimathea, of which we read in John 19:41-42. Among the earliest adherents to the belief that this was the Sepulchre of Christ was General Gordon (1882) who was a Bible student as well as a notable British soldier. The garden is a quiet and pleasant spot, lying at the foot of the tomb-covered green hill, just without the city wall, a congenial place for quiet meditation. The rounded hill has a resemblance of the human skull.

Some articles will relate the experiences and activities of early Christians and the fellowship of Baptists thoughout the past twenty centuries.

This month I am giving from Fox's Book of Martyrs, pp. 8, 9, what some of our brethren and sisters suffered in the second century A.D. This was the fourth persecution, under Marcus Aurelius Antoninus, beginning in 162 A.D.

"The cruelties used in this persecution were such that many of the spectators shuddered with horror at the sight, and were astonished at the intrepidity of the suffers. Some of the martyrs were obliged to pass, with their already wounded feet, over thorns, nails, sharp shells, etc. upon their



said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay.

7. And go quickly, and tell his disciples that he is risen from the dead; and, behold, he goeth before you into Galilee; there shall ye see him: lo, I have told you.

8. And they departed quickly from the sepulchre with fear and great joy; and did run to bring his disciples word.

9. And as they went to tell his disciples, behold. Jesus met them, saying, All hail. And they came and held him by the feet, and worshipped him.

10. Then said Jesus unto them, Be not afraid; go tell my brethren that they go into Galilee, and there shall they see me.

INTRODUCTION

As a matter of introduction, I will not be guilty of sanctioning the claims of many writers that Jesus was buried on Friday and arose again on Sunday morning. This argument denies the plain teaching of the word of God, including our Memory Selection, "For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. I am not interested in the traditions of the Roman church as well as others, in Lent, Good Friday, etc.

Those who contend for the above tell us that Jesus was crucified and buried the day before the Jewish Sabbath, and this was bound to have been on Friday. It is true that the scriptures teach that Jesus was crucified and buried the day before the Sabbath, but this was not the Jewish Sabbath, it was the Passover Sabbath. Christ was crucified on the day of preparation, not the preparation for the weekly Jewish Sabbath, but the day of preparation for the Passover Sabbath, which Passover was eaten on the fourteenth day of the first month at even annually, and the fifteenth was a Sabbath. Ex. 12:16; Lev. 23:5-7 It was the beginning of the feast of unleavened bread that lasted seven days and occurred only once a year. Thus we see the reason for the special description of this preparation day and Sabbath in John 19:31, "The Jews therefore, because it was the preparation, that the bodies should not remain upon the cross on the Sabbath day (for that Sabbath day was an high day) besought Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away.'

PLAIN FACTS PLAINLY STATED

The Passover lamb was killed in the evening between the 13th and 14th of Nisan, a Lunar month held sacred by the Jews, and it was eaten that night. Ex. 12:6-8. the 14th day following this night was preparation day for the Sabbath that always fell on the 15th of the same month. On this preparation day Christ was crucified and buried. He lay in the grave over the Sabbath which occurred on Thursday; this was one day and night; he then lay in the grave over

TIBERIAS

Tiberias on the western shores of the Sea of Galilee was founded by Herod Antipas, Tetrarch of Galilee in 21 A.D. During the city's construction, a Jewish necropolis (cemetery) was uncovered and Jews refused to live there for fear of ritual contamination through contact with the dead. It remained exclusively pagan for many years and we have no evidence that Jesus ever entered the site. Tiberias later became a seat of Jewish scholarship. By the second century the Sanhedrin was located here. It was in Tiberias, that the Mishna and the Jerusalem Talmud were compiled, and Hebrew scriptural punctuation was composed. After serving as the capital of the Galilee during Crusader times, Tiberias declined in subsequent centuries. It is currently a growing Jewish city of 25,000 known for its therapeutic hot springs.

Friday; this was two days and nights; he then lay in the grave over the weekly Sabbath (Saturday) and was resurrected in the very end of the Sabbath and the dawning into the first day of the week. This proves beyond question that Jesus lay in the grave three whole days and three whole nights, a total of 72 hours. No one would dare deny that Jonah was three whole days and nights in the whale's belly, so why would anyone desire to deny the very words of Jesus, "For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth." Matt. 12:40

He fastens the charge, not only on the scribes and Pharisees, but the whole nation of the Jews; they were all like their leaders. a seed and succession of evil-doers. They were an evil generation indeed, that not only hardened themselves against the conviction of Christ's miracles, but set themselves to abuse him, and put contempt on his miracles. They were an adulterous generation; so miserably degenerated from the faith and obedience of their ancestors, that Abraham and Israel acknowledged them

He refuses to give them any other sign than he had already given them, but that of the prophet Jonas. Note, Though Christ is always ready to hear and answer holy desires and prayers, yet he will not gratify corrupt lusts and humours. Those who ask amiss, ask, and receive not. Signs were granted to those who desired them for the confirmation of their faith, as to Abraham and Gideon: but were denied to those who demanded them for an excuse of their un-

Justly might Christ have said, They shall have the same signs still repeated for their further benefit and more abundant conviction. They shall have one sign of a different kind from all these, and that is, the resurrection of Christ from the dead by his own power, called here the sign of the prophet Jonas; this was yet reserved for their conviction, and was intended to be the great proof of Christ's being the Messiah; for by that, "he was declared to be the Son of God with power." Romans 1:4 That was such a sign as surpassed all the rest. "If they will not believe the former signs, they will believe this (Exod. 4:9) and if this will not convince them, nothing will." And yet the unbelieving Jews found an evasion to shift off that too, by saying, "His disciples came and stole him.away." None are so incurably blind as those who are resolved they will not see.

THE LESSON

The grave was to Christ as the belly of the whale was to Jonah; thither he was thrown as a ransom for lives ready to be lost in a storm; there he lay, as in the belly of hell, and seemed to be cast out of God's sight. Jonah 2:2 Jesus continued in the grave just as long as Jonah continued in the whale's belly, three days and three nights. So long as Jonah was a prisoner for his own sins, so long Christ was a prisoner for ours. As Jonah in the whale's belly comforted himself with an assurance that he should look again toward God's holy temple (Jonah 2:4), so Christ when he lay in the grave, is expressly said to rest in, hope, as one assured he should not see corruption. Acts 2:26-27.



When a child of God sins, it is the natural, and not the spiritual man which sins, because the inward man which has taken on the nature of God cannot sin. See I John 3:9 and I John 5:18. If one who has partaken of that new nature cannot sin, it is impossible for him to be lost, since sin is the only cause of the separation of man from God. Even though the outward man sins, he will not be lost. David said in Psa. 37:23-24: "The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord; and he delighteth in his way; though he fall, HE SHALL NOT BE UTTERLY CAST DOWN: for the Lord upholdeth him with his hand."

Jesus said: "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me: And I give unto them ETERNAL LIFE; and they shall NEVER perish, neither shall ANY MAN pluck them out of my hand. My father, which gave them me, is greater than all; and NO MAN is able to pluck them out of Father's hand," Jno. 10:27-29. child of God is in Christ, and he with Christ is in God (Col. 3:3). "For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God." After being saved a child of God is sealed by the Holy Spirit (Eph. 4:30); therefore, to bring back under his dominion a person that has been saved by the grace of God, the Devil would have to break the seal of the Holy Spirit, go through God, the Father, then through Christ; thereby, overpowering the Trinity in the God-head. If we had to depend upon ourselves for the preservation of our souls, there would be no hope; but we are kept by the power of God. See I Peter 1-5. As God is all-powerful, a believer cannot fall away so as to be lost. Paul said: "For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, no angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor ANY OTHER CREATURE, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." After one has once been saved, there is not the slightest possibility of his ever being lost again. "For I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day, Tim. 1:12.

points, others were scourged until their sinews and veins lay bare, and after suffering the most excruciating tortures that could be devised, they were destroyed by the most terrible deaths.

Germanicus, a young man, but a true Christian, being delivered to the wild beasts on account of his faith, behaved with such astonishing courage that several pagans be-

came converts to a faith which inspired such fortitude.

Polycarp, the venerable bishop of Smyrna, hearing that persons were seeking for him, escaped, but was discovered by a child. After feasting the guards who apprehended him, he desired an hour in prayer, which being allowed, he prayed with such fervency, that his guards repented that they had been instrumental in taking him. He was, however, carried before the proconsul, condemned, and burnt in the market place.

The proconsul then urged him, saying, "Swear, and I will release thee; - reproach Christ."

Polycarp answered, "Eighty and six years have I served him, and he never once wronged me; how then shall I blaspheme my King, Who hath saved me?" 'At the stake, to which he was only tied, but not nailed as usual, as he assured them he should stand immovable, the flames, on their kindling the fagots, encircled his body, like an arch, without touching him; and the executioner, on seeing this, was ordered to pierce him with a sword, when so great a quantity of blood flowed out as extinguished the fire.

But his body, at the instigation of the enemies of the Gospel, especially Jews, was ordered to be consumed in the pile, and the request of his friends, who wished to give it Christian burial, rejected. They nevertheless collected his bones and as much of his remains as possible, and caused them to be decently interred.

I wish to add these words relative to Polycarp. One of the twelve Apostles, John, was baptized by John the Baptist. (Luke 1:17, 76-80; Acts 1:22; Luke 6:12-16, I Cor. 12:28). John, the Apostle, baptized Polycarp on Dec. 25, 95 A.D. (Neander's Church History, p. 285). Polycarp organized the Partus church at the foot of the Tiber in 150 A.D. (Cyrus' Commentary of Antiquity, p. 924). The history of our present day Missionary Baptist Churches goes back through the Welsh Baptists from America to Wales, to Italy where the church at Turan was organized in 237 A.D. (Armitage Church History, p. 182). The Turan church was organized by Tellestman, who came from the church at Turan which was organized by Polycarp.

We can well see how a true Christian, killed under the powers of Rome, left his influence upon the world, and we today, should say, "Thank God for Polycarp and his courage and faith."

BOOK

As Jonah on the third day was released from his prison and came to the land of the living again, so Christ on the third day returned to life and arose from the grave to send forth the gospel of salvation to the world.

THE MEN OF NINEVEH

Now Christ represents the people of the Jews, as a generation that would be condemned by the men of Nineveh, who repented at the preaching of Jonah, would arise up against them in judgment. Christ's resurrection is the answer to the sign of the prophet Jonah to all, but to the Jews it will not have so happy an effect as the effect it had on the men of Nineveh, for they were by it brought to such repentance as prevented their ruin, but the Jews hardened in such unbelief as to hasten their ruin; and in the dayof judgment, the repentance of the Ninevites will be an aggravation of the sin and consequently the damnation of those to whom Christ preached then, and of those to whom Christ is preached now; for this reason, because Christ is greater than Jonah. If the men of Nineveh arise in judgment with that generation of Jews to whom Christ spoke, and shall condemn it, is it not a fact that both saint and sinner will be at the same judgment?

CHRIST GREATER THAN JONAH

Jonah was but a man, Jesus is the Son of God. Jonah was a stranger in Nineveh, he came among those who were prejudiced against his country; but Christ came to his own, when he preached to the Jews. Jonah preached but one short sermon as he passed along the streets, but Christ renewed his calls, he sat and preached and also preached in the synagogues. Jonah preached nothing but wrath and ruin within forty days, gave no directions or instructions nor encouragements to repent, but Christ beside warnings of danger has shown wherein we must repent, and assured us of acceptance upon our faith in Christ. Jonah wrought no miracles to confirm his doctrine and showed no good will to the Ninevites, but Christ wrought abundance of miracles, and all miracles of mercy: yet the Ninevites repented at the preaching of Jonah, but the Jews were not moved by Christ's preaching.

THE THREE DAYS AND NIGHTS

It is affirmed by some bible expositors that during the three days and nights that the body of Christ lay in the tomb; the He, in Spirit, went and preached to the disembodied spirits in Hades (the unseen state). This is their interpretation of I Peter 3:18-20.

Let us examine this position: "For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit: By which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison; Which sometime were disobedient, when once the longsuffering of God waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, wherein few, that is, eight souls were saved by water."

The twentieth verse tells us when the preaching was done — "in the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, and when the longsuffering of God waited." Noah was a preacher of righteousness. The spirits in prison were the unsaved in Noah's time, and Noah preached to them by the same Spirit that quickened the dead body of Christ. See Isaiah 61:1
