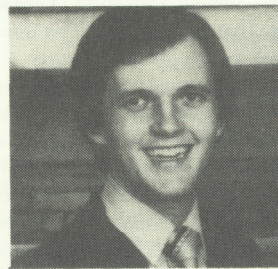

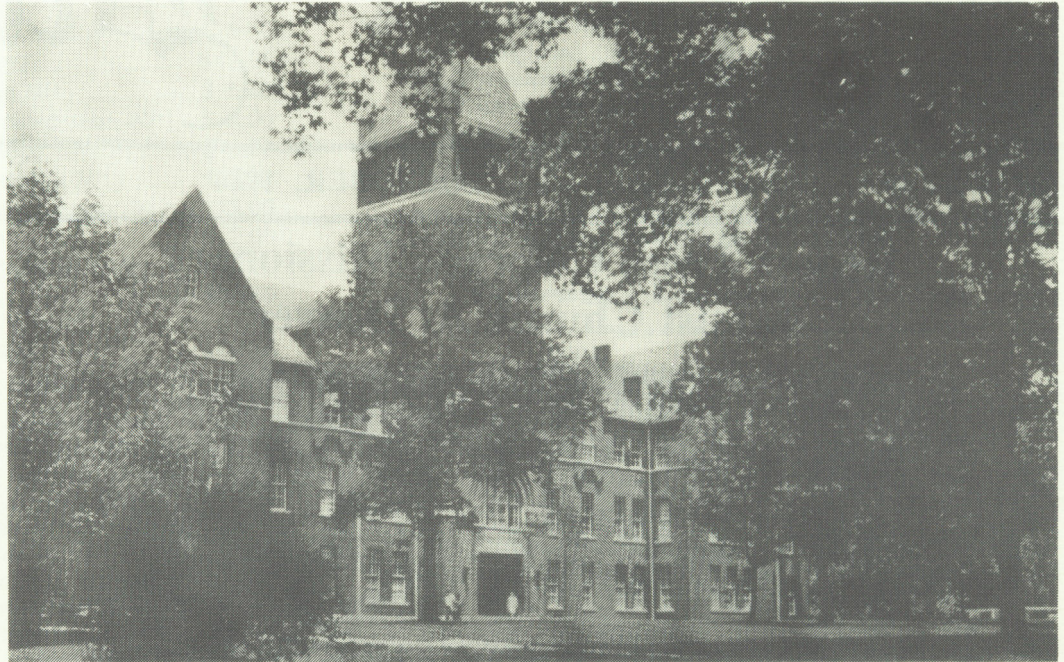

The Dome of the Rock

MOUNT MORIAH

Beneath the dome of this magnificent building lies the rock of Mount Moriah. It is 5 yards long, 12 yards wide and rises to a height of 2 yards above the ground. This is the traditional rock where Abraham prepared to sacrifice his son, Isaac. Moslems believe that Abraham took his son Ishmael, to sacrifice and not Isaac. They also believe that the prophet Mohammed ascended to heaven in a night journey from this rock. During the period of the Crusaders, the rock was surrounded by an iron screen to prevent pilgrims from taking pieces and selling them as souvenirs. The iron screen was replaced in 1959 by a wooden balustrade. The interior of the building, with the beautifully decorated cupola, the richly coloured stained glass windows and the lovely mosaic of the walls, offer a charming variety of colours and an enchanting atmosphere for worship.

Sirs what must I do to be saved? Acts 16:30

The above is a sincere and open question from a man who was convicted of sin, and was inquiring as to how he could be saved. Since he was already convicted, he was told: "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house." Acts 16:31. And this was an honest answer to an honest question, for there is no other way to be saved; because the Bible says, "Neither is there salvation in any other; for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." Acts 4:12.

Man is a sinner and needs to be saved above everything else

The Bible reveals to us that all have sinned, we came into this world with a sinful nature. Note some Scriptures: "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin, and so death passed upon all men, for all have sinned." Romans 5:12; "As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one; There is none that understandeth, there is none that seeketh after God." Romans 3:10, 11; "All we like sheep have gone astray; and we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on Him, (on Jesus Christ) the iniquity of us all." Isaiah 53:6.

We cannot save ourselves by our own works

If we could work our way into favor with God and into heaven, then Jesus Christ died in vain. Why all the suffering and the shedding of blood of our blessed Saviour on that old rugged cross, if man could just reform himself, join some church, be baptised and go into heaven that way? It just cannot happen that way, because the Bible makes it very clear that salvation doesn't come by works of righteousness which we have done. Note: "Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost;" Titus 3:5; "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves; it is a gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast." If we could save ourselves by our own works, we could receive some of the credit, and we would be boasting, but God hasn't fixed a plan so that we can do that. Salvation is a gift of God, and all the honor belongs to Him.

The power of God must draw sinners

Jesus Christ said, "No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him; and I will raise him up at the last day." John 6:44. Sinners are not inclined to come to Jesus, it is against his nature. So God has to deal with him through the testimony of His Word and the Power of the Holy Spirit. These are means of His power, which reaches into the heart of sinners, drawing them to Jesus Christ, who is the only Saviour of sinners. The apostle Paul said of the Gospel: "For I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ; for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth;" Romans 1:16 Hearing this Word, the Gospel, and the Holy Spirit using the Word to reprove of sin, the sinner is convicted of sin and realizes his need for forgiveness. So he is willing to call on the Lord for deliverance. Conviction of sin produces sorrow for sin, godly sorrow, and godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of; but the sorrow of the world worketh death, II Corinthians 7:10. Are you saved? Where will you spend eternity?

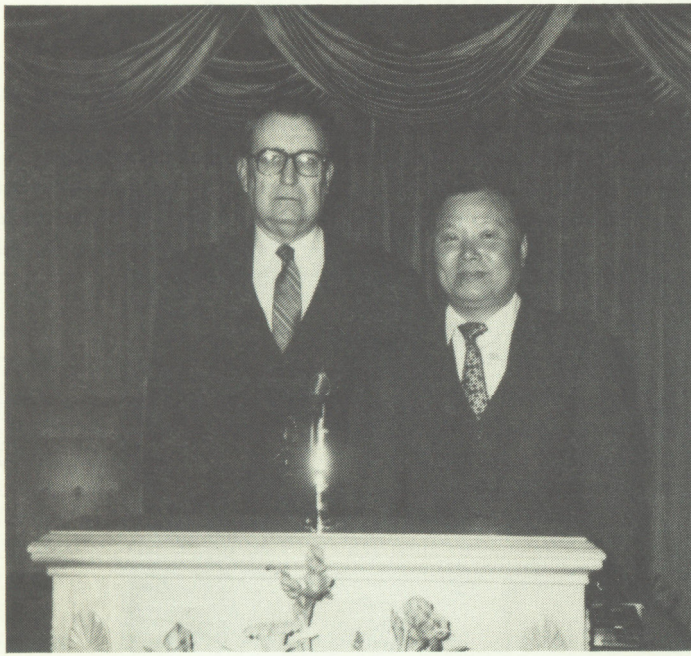
Wiseman Missionary Baptist Association to convene

REPORT FROM JAPAN

Dear Elder H. C. Vanderpool:

Time has passed quickly since I left New Bethel April 20, where I was given such an honorable pulpit to preach at its spring revival. I know many of your people want to know what happened to me since then. In fact I received a letter from a Baptist in Indiana this morning asking me such question. I have written letters, yet I still have many ones to write. I hope this will do in favour of you by putting in the paper. This is my "Thank You" letter to you and to your people who did so much for me while I was in America this past March and April.

The Baptist Ministers School was an inspiration to me and to my ministry, which will be long remembered not only among my family and I, but also among our people here in Japan. We appreciate Dr. and Mrs. Mike Collins of Bowling Green, Ky. who paid the round trip expenses for me to come to the school. It was such a blessed opportunity to meet Baptist preachers who came from many places.

We appreciate those churches that invited me to come and preach, where I had a wonderful fellowship with Baptist people. This time I could visit churches in West Tennessee and North Carolina, and a church in Oregon. We appreciate those Baptist preachers and Baptist people who gave me good food, lodging, books, tapes, love offerings, transportation and other things. We thank those who took me around to meet people and to have a good time of fellowship both in public and private, even to preach on TV programs. We surely owe them love. We thank Bro. and Mrs. Jackie Wilburn and his family who did too much for me sacrificially to make my stay comfortable. We appreciate Mr. and Mrs. Bill Petty who offered their house for me to use as my headquarters like they did in the past.

Since I left Nashville April 21, I visited Kokomo and Fellowship of Indianapolis. Then I went to Waterville, Minn. to see my son Luke and his wife Sylvia, and my first-born grandson, Luke Koji, 3 months old at that time. It was a good time for all of us. Then I crossed the Continental by bus to the west coast to meet BVro. John R. Blalock and his family of Portland, Oregon. As I was in a hurry to go home, I could not stay longer than a day. I still feel sorry. I

also feel sorry that I could not visit Missouri even though Bro. Keith Frieze and his people had plans to welcome me.

After returning home from the States, I have been a plenty of busy. We held our spring revival with Bro. Kenny Hensley, and I helped revival in Tokyo, which was with Bro. William James who has been in Japan for over 33 years. Lord blessed all of our efforts.

Hot and dry summer is about to go. Two days ago it recorded 103 degrees in Fahrenheit, 39.5 degrees in Centigrade. We won't have that hot days from now on. My family and I are just fine. This is one of Lord's blessings. I am just healthy, which is good for the services of the Lord. We are doing all right for the Lord day after day, for which we are thankful.

School Established

New Bethel Missionary Baptist School was established May 27, 1984, by the authority of New Bethel Missionary Baptist Church, 1080 Old Dickerson Pike, Goodlettsville, Tennessee. This is the oldest Baptist Church in Metropolitan Nashville, Tennessee, and this year (1984) it celebrated its 190th Anniversary, having been organized in 1794, during the administration of President George Washington. This was two years before Tennessee became a state.

The church has sponsored many missions of various natures at home and throughout the United States, and in foreign countries. And while the church is involved at present in several projects, it is the desire of this people to further Christian and Ministerial Education through this school.

Being aware of the multiplicity of schedules of ministers, pastors, missionaries and many laymembers, and the possible conflict of same with set hours in classrooms for study, it was decided to begin the school by offering Home Study Courses through correspondence.

INFORMATION

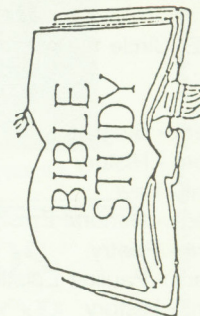

This level is recommended for those concerned about Bible Background studies, especially History 301, and History 302. The prophecy of Revelation is included in this level.

*Level 4, is the most advanced level of studies.
