1. SINNER'S ACCOUNTABILITY Salvation By Grace Through Repentance And Faith

"And (Jesus) saying, The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye, and believe the gospel." Mark 1:15

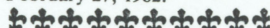

Ordination Service



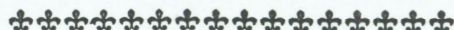

NO MISSION, NO CHURCH

Had it not been for the mission of John the Baptist, there would not have been a church. God sent John to prepare the way for Christ. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. John 1:6. Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: And the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his Temple, Malachi 3:1. John the Baptist fulfilled his mission well. He began preaching, "Repent Ye: For the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand." In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judaea, and saying, Repent Ye: For the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand. Matthew 3:2-1. Then demanded those who came to his baptism, to bring forth fruits, meet for repentance: "Then went out to him Jerusalem, and all Judaea, and all the region round about Jordan, and were baptized of him in Jordan, con-

fessing their sins. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sad'du-ces come to his Baptism, he said unto them, O Generation of Vipers, who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bring forth therefore fruits, meet for repentance:" Matthew 3:5-8. "And it came to pass in those days that he went out into a mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God. And when it was day, he called unto him his disciples: and of them he chose twelve, whom also he named Apostles:" Luke 6:12-13. "These twelve Jesus sent forth, and commanded them, saying, go not into the way of the Gentiles, and into any city of the Sa'mar'i-tans enter ye not: But go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel." Matthew 10:5-6. The Church like John the Baptist fulfilled this mission well. Then in Matthew 28-16-20 Jesus gave the Church the Worldwide Mission. "Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, into a mountain where Jesus had appointed them. And when they saw him, they worshipped him: But some doubted. And Jesus came and

spake unto them, saying, all power is given unto me in Heaven and in Earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations. Baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: And, Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the World. Amen." This mission was to begin after the Day of Pentecost and be carried on unto the End of the world as stated in Matthew 28:20. "But Ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: And Ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Sa-mari-a, and unto the uttermost part of the Earth." Acts 1:8. Not only was the church commanded to teach all nations, but every creature in all nations. Mark 16:15. Are the Old Fashion Missionary Baptist Churches doing as good a job today, with the World Wide Mission, as the church did just after Pentecost? Some states in this nation are blessed with lots of Old Fashion Missionary Baptist Churches. Others are not. I am thankful for all of our Old Fashion Missionary Baptist Churches. I wish there was at least one in every state. There was a time when this nation did not have even one Old Fashion Missionary Baptist Church in it. And it would not have one in it today, if the church at Jerusalem had not obeyed Christ command. I am so thankful the church come across the Great Deep on a Mission to this nation and through that Mission lots of other churches have been organized. Thank God for their labors.

It was announced several months back by Bethel Missionary Baptist Church of our call to a Mission field in Arkansas. And I was recommended to sister churches to preach in their pulpits, as we make preparations to go to the field. Since that time we have preached in 60 of our sister churches. We have received a warm welcome in every one of them, for which we are grateful. We have several appointments given by other sister churches that we will be filling, as we continue to make preparations. We plan to hold the first service at the Mission the first Sunday in August 1983. Until that time we will be busy. We will travel lots of miles as we go to and from these appointments. We request your prayers.

Brother M. V. Hammack was born in Macon County, Tennessee in the community of

ly perfection. "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast." Ephesians 2:8-9; Titus 3:5.

Any esteem of self-knowledge or deed is totally unacceptable without sure, real, true salvation. See I Peter 4:18 People are trying differently revised methods in an attempt to be saved and get to heaven. "Then said one unto him, Lord, are there few that be saved? And he said unto them, Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able." Luke 13:23-24 I think these verses particularly explain that many traditional and technical theories will come to naught.

God's wonderful plan pardons all of a person's shortcomings, evil thoughts, conversation, and actions when he or she is saved. 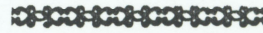

Israel Reports Earliest God's Name Inscription

TEL AVIV (UPI) - An Israeli archaeologist has found the earliest inscription of God's name ever discovered in Jerusalem etched on a seventh century B. C. silver prayer scroll, an Israeli newspaper reported recently.

The scroll, made of 99.9% pure silver, was discovered

three years ago by Tel Aviv University archaeologist Gabriel Barkay, but was only unraveled last month in a laboratory by use of a special technique, the Jerusalem Post, said.

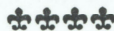
