INTRODUCTION

"The sceptre shall not depart from Judah, nor a lawgiver from between his feet, until Shiloh come; and unto him shall the gathering of the people be: Genesis 49:10 Shiloh, was of course, Jesus Christ His coming was promised unto Adam in Genesis 3:15 and from that time on all the services showed forth his coming. As God deals with a disobedient people and brings their hearts and minds back to him, he tells them of the blessings they will receive and of the blessings their offsprings will receive because of a few that will be faithful in the faith until Christ shall come. As we study this lesson remember the instruction in Haggai 1:5 "Now therefore thus saith the Lord of hosts; consider your ways.'

WORK PROGRESSES

When the people had understood their condition and their need of God, they turned their hearts to him and took up the work of rebuilding the temple. We see from the writing of Ezra 3:12 that the beginning of this work brought great joy to the old people that had seen the first temple. The Lord asked if this temple will compare in beauty with the first temple. They know it will not be as well built as the temple Solomon built, but they have gone through the captivity and are able to rejoice as this work is done for they know

the Lord is in this matter. Indeed the Lord informs them that he has not forgotten his covenant with Israel and that his Spirit is with them. God reminds them that he brought them out of Egypt and he will continue to walk with all that will place their trust in him. The Lord now reminds these people that this building is not the final or the greatest of his works to be done in this world. He reminds them of another promise that he had made. The covenant he had made with Abraham.

BETTER COVENANT

"And to Jesus the mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling, that speaketh better things than that of Abel." Hebrews 12:24 "By so much was Jesus made a surety of a better testament. And they truly were many priests, because they were not suffered (permitted) to continue by reason of death: But this man, because he continueth even, hath an unchangeable priesthood." Hebrews 7:22-24 Abraham knew about the new covenant that was to come. He knew about the Son of God that was to die. He knew about the church kingdom that was to supersede the law. We have the work of God to prove this in Hebrews 11:9-10 "By faith he sojourned in the land of promise, as in a strange country, dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise: For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God." That city is the church. Abraham knew of these things and he longed to see it. But he did not get to be a part of it. His work

nor even in Athens or Rome or anywhere else in the world at that time.

It is possible to visit the remains of the temple where Jesus first revealed His greatness. It is possible to stand in its shadow, and to touch its ancient stones. This is the western wall—one of the most important religious shrines in the world.

When one understands the significance of the wall, and of the temple of which it was part, one also can understand why Jesus was impelled to leave His family so He could discuss religious affairs with the great scholars who sat there.

The temple was first built by the mightly King Solomon during the years around 960 B.C.E. The First Book of Kings describes the great building, a magnificent structure where cascades of fresh flowers were heaped upon altars of gold, and where in the springtime the wise son of David gathered the nation to dedicate the temple of God.

The temple was built upon a great rock known as Moriah, the rock upon which Abraham offered the life of his son Isaac to the command of God. Once the temple was built, Solomon moved the ark of the covenant, the first tabernacle built by Moses three centuries before, to the most sacred chambers—the Holy of Holies.

In the subsequent centuries, the temple of Jerusalem became the center of Jewish religious, communal, and scholarly life. It is even safe to say that the temple became the very center of Judaism—for here most of the great prophets and saints of Scripture imparted their wisdom, their prophetic gifts, and their holiness.

When Nebuchadnezzar conquered Jerusalem and destroyed the temple during 587 B.C.E., he carried the Jews away to bondage in Babylon. And from that bondage comes a most ancient prayer which reveals the exiles' yearning to return home to the city of the temple.

"By the rivers of Babylon, there we sat down, yea, we wept, when we remembered Zion.

"If I forget thee, O Jerusalem, let my right hand forget her cunning.

"If I do not remember thee, let my tongue cleave to the roof of my mouth; if I prefer not Jerusalem above my chief joy" (Psalms 137:1,5,6).

Seventy years later, when King Cyrus of Persia won control of the Babylonian Empire, he freed the Jews, and they returned to Jerusalem and rebuilt their temple. The great joy of the restoration is related in the gifted writings of Isaiah,

Ezra, and Nehemiah. And the second temple reassumed the prominence of its predecessor, gathering to it all the greatest religious and intellectual vitality of the nation.

By the time Jesus entered the temple, the institution had a history of nearly a thousand years. It was a structure which inspired, a structure which aroused the strongest sentiments of the Jewish people. It was a building dedicated to the first commandment of God, "I am the Lord thy God....

"Thou shalt have no other gods before me."

History reveals the singleminded devotion the Jews had to this commandment, and the temple which was the most important structure honoring God. For example, when Alexander the Great marched through Israel, the Jews acquiesced to the stronger Greek rule. But when Antiochus, a successor of Alexander, established Greek pagan worship in the temple, the Jews rose in fanatical revolt against a much stronger army-and drove them out of the temple, purified the building, and rededicated it to God.

All this had passed when the young Jesus entered the sacred precincts. At that time there were two groups of Jewish sages associated with the temple. The Pharisees were strong advocates of religious influence over daily life. They were reformers who make great efforts to discourage Jews from adopting foreign modes, especially the casual cultures of Greece and Rome. They were the religious orthodox which grew after the return from Babylonian captivity. The Pharisees were generally ascetic, with little regard for wealth or pleasures. By the time of Christ, however, there were several complaints that the sect had grown too formal, that they had become pedantic in their interpretations of religious law, that they had begun to lose sight of the human elements of religion.

The Sadducees were the temple aristocracy. They focused their attention on Jewish law as written in the first five Books of the Bible. Unlike the Pharisees, they tended to ignore later traditions and were not inclined to interpret and debate various merits. Some scholars presume that the Sadducees organized to counter balance the influence of the Pharisees, and to offer greater emphasis to the law of Moses. The Sadducees were more tolerant of foreign influence so long as it did not interfere with the exercise of Jewish law.

The temple was a lively institution. In addition to being a building of worship, it also had a long history of serving as an intellectual, philosophical, and religious forum where various sects challenged one another with speeches and debate. The temple was the vibrant seat of Judaic culture.

At times, people took advantage of the liberal policies of the temple and abused them by introducing commerce and other non-spiritual activities into the temple precincts. Christians are familiar with Jesus chasing the dove sellers and money changers from the Temple, but they should also recall that Jesus was not the first reformer of this sort. Periodically through the preceeding thousand years, reformers successfully challenged abusers of the temple's sacred functions

Despite the occasional abuse, the temple served the nation admirably for a millenium. The greatness crumbled shortly after the time of Christ. In the year 70, the temple was again destroyed. Paganism again figured into the destruction, as the Emperor Nero tried to impose the worship of his Roman pantheon on the Jews and brought desecration to the temple. The Jews rebelled again, but this time the might of the foreign invader was simply too great for even the most spirited resistence. As revenge against the revolt, Rome destroyed Jerusalem and its temple. About one million Jews were killed in the fighting throughout Israel, and the survivors were banished from the land.

Yet a remnant remained. A few Jews stayed behind in the land of Israel to maintain ancient traditions. And a part of the great temple still stood—its western wall.

Through the next twenty centuries. Jews had no sovereignty in their ancient homeland. Their fortunes ebbed and flowed with the policies of whoever occupied the land-after the Romans came the Byzantines and the Persians, then the Arabs and Seljuks, the Crusaders and the Mamluks, the Ottoman Turks and the British. In 1948, when the British abandoned their mandate, Israel's war of independence found Jerusalem split in two-and the western wall fell to the Arab side. For the next 19 vears. Jews were prohibited from approaching the western wall, and it was not until the Six-Day War of 1967 that Israeli paratroopers wrested the western wall and its Temple precincts from the hands of the Arab Legion.

Jewish sovereignty over the temple precincts was proclaimed by Lt. Gen. Mordechai Gur, the Israeli commander who physically led his troops in the capture of the ancient shrine. His front line radio message announced: "Temple Mount is in our hands! Temple Mount is ours!"

was unequaled and nonrepeatable.

John wrote, "Beloved lust us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love. In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world that we might live through him." I John 4:7-9; Matt. 1:21.

This kind of love is known by the unmerited grace of God. I'm worried that we've mixed-up SOME by backwardly exaggerating about the effects of being saved (extraordinary claims of seeing a light, vision, hearing a voice, running around shouting, feeling magnificent, fantastic, etc.). Even when sincere, by SOME figurative accounts are disturbing to those who just felt the burden rolled away and salvation 'like a gentle touch of the wind' when saved.

The devil wants to cause Christians to misunderstand what will help and drive away other saved people, causing them to go for years doubting and without telling about their salvation. God can show anyone whether they are saved or lost and will if a person asks Him in the right way.

I've heard many refer to this relationship from God through Jesus Christ by the Holy Spirit as a peak space of faultless time in their conversion, perhaps unmeasurable by human thought when they "left this world" to spring up like a newborn babe. This subject surpasses our weak ability to tell about it. God saved me when I got salvation down to right then, at once, in my heart, wanting him to save me His way more than all else. I felt something good inside, peace and joy, and the biggest burden that I've ever had rolled away. I've been joined together with the Lord by salvation since then. To meet me in heaven, you must go to the same fountain and drink, passing from death unto life. washed in the blood of the Lamb, redeemed, sanctified, and complete with the Holy Spirit, when I was born of incorruptible seed, all at one time.

These Bible expressions represent true repentance to God and faith, or trust, or belief in Jesus our everlasting and our universal, infinite Saviour, foreordained before creation. Study I Peter 1:20.

The pitiful loss of not soundly preparing to die is the most gross and horrible cruelty ever persuaded and enticed by that evil spirit of the devil. If you're lost, Satan wants you to wait confused until God won't hear your desolate, barren prayers.

Living condemned is a hard, rough life through the violence and crime of this world. Sinners are without peace of mind and can't understand their haunting situation of uselessness to God.

There are only two ways when death comes – one saved, one lost – no middle average, refer to II Cor. 2:15. It is better never being born, or dying safely before future accountability, than to pass away as a poor condemned sinner without salvation.

"For the preaching of the cross to them that perish foolishness: but unto us which are saved it is the power of God." I Cor. 1:18. Please study Luke 19:10; John 10:9; Rev. 1:18. All substitutes, if extreme or practical, won't work. How can sinners let the devil actually cheat them into neglecting an opportunity to call on the Lord? God's sovereignty cannot be changed by us and no rational lost person who knows right from wrong, has to go through this world without voluntarily making an altar and spiritually pouring out his heart to God, when he spiritually knocks upon the door of his heart. Study Deu. 32:39; I Sam. 2:6.

It is unbearably sad to think of the millions who are lost, such a large percentage, and maybe vast majority of the population that I wouldn't attempt to guess numerically. "And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth that they might be saved." If Thess.

Sinners, please don't momentarily put off seeking the Lord for salvation because his second coming, although unexpected by many, is imminent and nearing, read II Cor. 6:1-2. Evidently many think this option of grace definitely will be lengthened which is Biblically uncertain. Any second of time or breath of air could be your last and Heaven or Hell would then be your eternal home. There isn't anything worth keeping you unsaved for a splitsecond. "For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world and lose his own soul? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?" Mark 8:36-37.

The sin of unbelief is what sends a sinner to hell. "And to whom sware he that they should not enter into his rest, but to them that believed not? So we see that they could not enter in because of unbelief." Heb. 3:18-19.

Blaspheming against the Holy Ghost is the only unforgivable sin. "Verily I say unto you, All sins shall be forgiven unto the sons of men,...But he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost hath never forgive-

ness, but is in danger of eternal damnation;" Mark 3:28-29.

Any troubles or problems that a sinner encounters, regardless of very unusual circumstances, cannot cause he or she to be saved unless the convicting power of God is dealing with their soul. When he or she readily admits past contradiction to being a penitent and guilty sinner, it becomes unreasonable to refuse the drawing power and conviction of the Holy Spirit.

When the Holy Spirit strives with your soul, GIVE UP. Missionary Baptists love you and want you to be saved! PRAY, ASK, BEG!!! "And the Spirit and the bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will let him take the water of life freely." Rev. 22:17. Golden keynote: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16.

God's gift is perfect. Think about and take this orthodox, canonical Word of Truth to heart. Please don't overlook salvation's complete scope of availability to all people. and Salem. Salem is approximately thirty miles north of Albany. As I mentioned earlier, both of us preached that evening. I went first, preaching from Galatians 6 chapter and taking a text from Psalms 126:5, "They that sow in tears shall reap in joy." Brother Compton followed reading from Hebrews 12:1-2 and taking his text from Isaiah 40:31, "They shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk and not faint." A handshake of Christian fellowship followed and the service was dismissed after testimonies and words of encouragement.

Brother Compton and I staved overnight at Brother Swanson's home. Our stay with them was most enjoyable. We awoke early on Saturday morning and prepared for another day of travel, preaching, and fellowship. Brother Compton and I, along with Brother and Sister Swanson, drove that morning to the community of Hauser, just outside of North Bend, Oregon. The drive was approximately three hours. However, it was a most pleasant drive through some very scenic areas of Oregon. North Bend and Coos Bay are adjoining cities of the Coos Bay area. The bay is a deep sea port where you will find many ocean going vessels. The main export is lum

ber and wood products. Because of the housing industry, this lumber community suffers very high unemployment. The highest being 35%.

The Lord also promised that he would fill this house in verse 7, and "this house" he speaks of is the church. All those that took part in the building of the temple was a part of the filling of the first covenant.

GLORY OF THE LATTER HOUSE

As we begin to look at the greatness and the beauty of this latter house, the church of the living God, we realize just how little and unlearned, and unworthy we are to be a part of it. And of course we are not a part of the church because of our goodness or ability, but because the Lord died for us, and when we were lost and undone, he reached down and took out the sinful heart and placed his love within. It is Christ that has made us fit subjects to be members of his church. There is only one kind of people that can be a part of this work, and that is people that have been saved by the blood of Christ. There is no greater place a person can hold in this world than that of a member of the church. Christ shed his blood for it. Acts 20:28 The Lord commissioned it to carry his gospel. Matthew 28:19-20. He promised the gates of hell would not prevail against it Matthew 16:18. Baptized it in his Spirit. Acts 2:1-4. Promised he would receive it to himself in heaven at the end of time and present it to himself without spot or wrinkle. Ephesians

There are so many things that can be said about the glory of this latter house. The above are a very few, and after we have used our whole life talking about this latter house we would not have even scratched the surface. How blessed we are that we live in this day and time and can be a part of this great and beautiful work. Abraham longed to see this day. He had a great desire to look upon the true temple in this world. He was not granted that privilege, but you and I are. I must go back to one of my favorite scriptures to again remind us of the blessing we have in the church. And these all, having obtained a good report through faith, received not the promise; God having provided some better thing for us, that they without us should not be made perfect." Hebrews 11:17-40.

Look at this great message. The world was not worthy of these saints of God that suffered so much in order to uphold their faith. And yet God has blessed us above them in that we are his church and they were

CONCLUSION

We have looked at the trouble natural Israel brought upon herself by forsaking the work of God. Look at her statement as she sat in captivity. Psalms 137:1-4 "By the rivers of Babylon, there we sat down, yea, we wept, when we remembered Zion. We hanged our harps upon the willows in the midst thereof. For there they that carried us away captive required of us a song; and they that wasted us required of us mirth, saying, sing us one of the songs of Zion. How shall we sing the Lord's song in a strange land."

Now you, as a church member, are a part of the spiritual Israel. God has promised he would bless as long as the people carried out his instructions. Take hold of this truth and this great heritage and be counted faithful to God.

My family and I are fine and are doing fine day after day for the glory of God and for people, for which we are thankful. We have good and gentle weather this winter, and this warm weather has helped us greatly. Our Baptist people are fine and are doing fine, for which we also thank the Lord. We heard our son Luke and his wife visited Tennessee from Minnesota and spent a few days with people of Carthage and went home to do his duty during Christmas holidays at his work. We feel good they have found a home in them miles away from their real home in Japan, and we appreciate Lord's people there in the States.

We had a nice and blessed Christmas services and fellowship meetings. Michiko and I got tired too much, yet it was a kind of sweet fatigue we had for the Lord and for people. So it was more than anything. We had good attendance to our services.

December 15th morning Michiko and I received a autoaccident on the city street of Hiroshima by a dump truck driver, who caused the wreck of five vehicles at the same time. He hit our 13 years and 11 months old station wagon, which we kept in good shape and condition as Lord's property, and gave it a great damage, however, praise the Lord, we did not have any troubles with our bodies at all. We thank the Lord for His wonderful protection. We have been good to the driver and the company he belongs to, and they have been good to us after knowing we are completely different people than those other ones had the accident. Abel's, but God said to Cain, "If thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted?" God doesn't overlook what we do that is according to His will; but men, the very best of them fall short. So we cannot say that we have done all things well, even though there is that inner desire to do everything pleasing to our Father in heaven. If we don't have that delight to do the Lord's will there is something radically wrong with us. I think we could say about the person who doesn't want to please his Maker, that such a person needs to be born again. But again, though we have the best intentions, and we strive to do our Father's good pleasure, we find faults within us, we cannot be perfect in this life. I heard a preacher say one time that once he decided to live a perfect life, but he went on to say that the more he tried to live perfect, the more faults he saw in himself. As I said before, we desire such a life, but we don't attain to it, because of the nature we were born with, and will have till the great resurrection morning, when we awake with His likeness. Psalm 17:15.

The Apostle Paul was a faithful servant of the Lord, he was willing to die for the Lord, and did finally die for Him; but Paul had a weakness, and he tells about it in one of his Epistles. "I find then a law, that, when I would do good, evil is present with me." Romans 7:21. But he goes on to say, "For I delight in the Law of God after the inward man." Romans 7:22.

THE PERFECT MAN

Jesus Christ was a man, a real man. He had a human body, and this is born out in several places in Scripture. "Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, He also likewise took part of the same; that through death He might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil." Hebrews 2:14. But He was without sin, the perfect man, and so all of His works were without fault, there was not one thing that He ever did that wasn't just what the Father sent Him to do; He did all that goes to make perfection. Men sought to find fault in Him, but they didn't find any. The man before whom the Jews brought Jesus for trial said, when the Jews were insistent for His crucifixion, "Why, what evil hath He done?" Matthew 27:23. Jesus was the perfect man, even his enemies being witness.

HIS PERFECT LIFE

Jesus Christ's life upon this earth was brief, about thirtythree years, but even if it had been one hundred and thirty years it still would have been

without sin. He was tempted of the devil, three times He was tempted of Satan in the wilderness just after His baptism, but each time He resisted with the Word of God (Matthew 4:1-10). He was tempted in all points as we are, yet without sin, Hebrews 4:15. His perfect life and perfect works spoke of what He was, though a man, the very Son of God. John spoke of Him as the Word, and he says, "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth." 1:14.

Even though the life of our Lord was never marred with sin, His perfect life doesn't save sinners. We are not saved by following the good examples of even one who did no sin, it took more than His perfect life to redeem us. However, if He had not lived the perfect life, He could not have made a perfect sacrifice, He could not have offered Himself without spot, for this was required, of which I want to mention under another heading in this article. Though we are not saved by following His good examples, but after we are saved, certainly we should strive to imitate our blessed Saviour in our walks and works. We must put things in their proper perspective, salvation is one thing, and serving the Lord is another. Let us see them in their right relation to each other. The Bible says this: "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath ordained that we should walk in them." Ephesians 2:10. You see, it is created in Christ Jesus unto good works, not good works in order to be created in Christ Jesus.

HIS PERFECT WORKS

It was a perfect work that caused those men to say of Jesus, "He hath done all things well; He maketh both the deaf to hear, and the dumb to speak." This was a perfect work, the man was made whole of his physical defects. This is unlike some of the modern day healers, who say they have the same kind of gift to heal. I give just one example: I knew a man back in the country, in fact, I had spent the night with him and his family several times when I was a teen-aged boy. He became very ill, and there seemed to be no hope for his recovery. A group of these healers came by one day and wanted to try their hand; well, the old fellow consented, they knelt around his bed and prayed, which was very good, I have done the same many times; then they laid their hands on him, and when the sick man didn't get up they took him up, and held him up and walked him around in the room, and then went off and reported that they had healed him, but in fact they almost wore the poor man out, he was made worse. But when our Lord spoke the Word, and laid His hand divine on a person He did a perfect work of healing. And of course His work of healing proved that He had power to forgive sins. "But that ve may know that the son of man hath power to forgive sins, (He said unto the sick of the palsy) I say unto thee, Arise, and take up thy couch, and go into thine house." Luke 5:24. Those people I mentioned above said that they had the sick man up and walking around before they left, but in fact they held the man up. But Jesus said to the man sick of the palsy, not only to walk, but to take up his bed and go to his house.

HIS PERFECT SACRIFICE

The person of our Lord was never tainted with sin; His life was perfect in every detail; His works no man could find a fault; and so He could make a perfect sacrifice for the sins of the world: He could offer Himself without spot to God. The sacrifices made of animals under the Law could never take away sins, they had to be repeated and repeated until the perfect Lamb of God should come, who would take away the sin of the World, "And every priest standeth daily ministering and offering oftentimes the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins: But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down on the right hand of God." Hebrews 10:11.12. He will not come again to make another offering of Himself, for God is satisfied, justice is satisfied, Jesus paid it all. "He shall see the travail of His soul, and shall be satisfied; by His knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for He shall bear their iniquities." Isaiah 53:11. 20202020202020202020

Elder G. O. Templeton

Elder G. O. Templeton was born June 8, 1909, the son of William and Nora Templeton of Bethpage, Tenn. He was reared on a farm and spent his entire life farming along with his ministry.

He was saved at Wolf Hill schoolhouse. After attending church for some time at Old Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church, he united with that body and was baptized into her fellowship by Elder R. O. Sanders on Nov. 11, 1934.

He was married to Miss Kathryn Williams on Nov. 4, 1928. Five sons and three daughters were born to this union.

He acknowledged his call to preach and was ordained to the full work of the gospel ministry by Old Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church in Sumner County, Tenn. in September, 1938. In the early part of his ministry he walked to some of his appointments. He was called to Buffalo Springs Baptist Church as his first pastorate. Churches served as pastor dates were: Buffalo and Springs, 1940-1953; Fairview, 1946-1950 and 1951-1958; Old Hopewell, 1953-1960; Pleasant 1950-1958: Rock Grove, Bridge, 1965-1972. Bro. Templeton was a good sound Baptist preacher and helped in several meetings where he witnessed a lot of people being saved, and then united with old fashioned Baptist churches. He and Elder R. O. Sanders held meetings in a tent and a home in Gallatin, Tenn. which was the beginning of the mission later organized into West End Missionary Baptist Church.

Bro. Templeton preached one of the best Introductory Sermons preached before the Wiseman Baptist Association in 1957 while convened with Concord Baptist Church. His text, "Endure hardness of a good soldier." Bro. Templeton sure had a hard time in this world as a preacher, but today he is resting from his labors, but his works will follow on.

He lived to see all his children saved, something he prayed hard for. He passed away on Nov. 17, 1982 in Gallatin, Tenn. Funeral services were conducted at Buffalo Springs Missionary Baptist Church, where he held membership, on Saturday, Nov. 20, 1982, at 11:00 A.M. which was conducted by Elder Bobby Hale, his pastor, and Elder James W. Briley. A large crowd attended. Bro. Templeton was buried in the Pleasant Grove Cemetery. Pallbearers were some of his preaching brethren: Elders C. L. (Dee) Russell, Ronnie Harrison, J. B. Robertson, Charles Vaughn, James (Pete) Porter and Harold D. Linville.

Bro. Templeton was a good man, a good pastor and a good sound preacher. He will be missed by all who knew him. Our loss is heaven's gain.

Footnote: We are now informed that Bro. Roark and family have returned to Bowling Green, Ky. to await another field of labor wherever the Lord may lead.





CALVARY

The site north of the Damascus Gate is believed by many to be the place of the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

In 1883, the British General Charles Gordon noted this rocky hill which resembled a human skull, and suggested that this might be the true Calvary. The presence of a nearby rock-hewn tomb, believed to be first century, helped to strengthen this idea, and the scriptural significance of the site appealed to many eminent Christians of that day.

An Association was formed, and by 1892, sufficient money was collected to purchase the tomb and its surroundings, and have it cared for by a resident warden. The Garden Tomb gives a clear picture of what the place of Crucifixion and burial of Christ must have looked like at the time of Jesus. The simplicity and beauty of the site and the peaceful atmosphere of The Garden Tomb, make it a favourable spot for prayer and meditation.

-It was the first proclamation of Jewish sovereignty over the sacred precincts since shortly after the time of Christ.

On holidays — particularly festive ones such as Simba Tora (Joy of the Law), the plaza around the wall is filled with people singing, praying, dancing, proclaiming their eternal attachment to the holy wall. In orthodox Jewish tradition, this wall is the closest an observant Jew should approach the temple precincts.

WAYS TO HELP YOUR PASTOR

1. PRAY FOR HIM. He is the only person in your church who does not have a pastor. Ask God to strengthen him physically, mentally and spiritually. The devil launches his greatest attacks against God's man. He needs your prayers!

2. BE POSITIVE WITH HIM AND ABOUT HIM. Most pastors hear enough bad news. Be sure to share with him the good news from your life. When you speak about him to other people, be positive. Remember, he is not perfect and will make mistakes. If you have criticisms, take them to the Lord on your knees, not to others in conversation.

3. RELIEVE HIM OF UNNECESSARY BURDENS. Let him be the leader of the church in spiritual matters. Do not make him the administrator of every little mundane chore around the church.

4. DO WHAT GOD HAS LED YOU TO DO. Don't expect your pastor to carry additional burdens that are a part of your ministry in the church. Find something that you can do and do it well!

5. KEEP THE LINES OF COMMUNICATION OPEN. If there is a need in your life, share it with him. He will want to pray with you and help you. If you know of needs in other people's lives, be sure to share those with him also. Let him know when a member goes to the hospital or has some legitimate need with which the pastor can help.
