




Bethlehem Baptist | Minister To Church Dedicated Remain Active

On Sunday, November 25, 1973, Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church, 1401 Lischey Avenue, Nashville, Tenn., had a dedicatory service for the purpose of dedicating the building located at this address. The dedication service was held in conjunction with the churches annual homecoming which is held on the fourth Sunday in November each year.

The church came into existence through efforts which officially began April 2, 1961, At this time, a number of Christian people met in a rented building at 1100 North Second St., Nashville, Tenn., to begin an effort meeting and to establish a mission. Elder B. G. Sutton held services at this

location each Sunday afternoon until June, 1961. Eld. Sutton and Elder O. E. Russell then began to hold services each Sunday morning. In March, 1962, they began to hold services on Sunday nights.

The Lord blessed their work and the attendance and interest grew. They were

During the year of 1972, I announced to New Bethel Church that I felt that my work as pastor was coming to an end.

The reason I made the announcement was that I felt at my age a younger pastor could offer better leadership. The church in regular conference appointed committee to find a pastor available. After some contact with about fifteen or sixteen ministers, it seemed that no one was available that the church could agree on. I informed the committee that I would not leave the church without a pastor, and I was elected to serve another year. I accepted the call with the understanding that I would only serve one more year. This they did, and the Lord blessed me and the church, perhaps with the greatest year of any I had served.

The church has now called Elder H. C. Vanderpool, who has already moved into the community, and is ready to begin his service as pastor January, 1974. The church is pleased to have Bro. and Sister Vanderpool and I am sure the Lord is

extended an arm from New Bethel Church, Goodlettsville. Tenn., to receive members. Elder W. T. Russell was pastor of the mother church at the time.

The people felt it to be God's will that they organize an independent church. In November, 1962, the Church was organized with 11 charter members. The Church called Elder B. G. Sutton as pastor and he was an able servant of the Lord until he resigned in April, 1971. At that time the Church called Elder O. E. Russell, who continues to serve as pastor today.

Soon after the organization, the Church was notified that the building they were using would be torn down. They bought a lot and erected a 40 by 60 foot basement at the present location. In the summer of 1967, they erected an auditorium onto the basement with measurements of 40 by 75 feet. The brethren of the church did most of the work themselves in their spare time.

At the annual homecoming and dedication service we were honored to have two very fine quartets, the Happiness Quartet and the Christian Aires. Midway of the service, Elder O. E. Russell, our pastor, asked Elder B. G. Sutton to say the dedication prayer. Elder Sutton thanked the Lord for giving the people of the

It Is So Easy To Stay Home and Find Fault

"But Thomas was not with them when Jesus came . . . But he said unto them . . . I will not believe" John 20:24-25.

Read the whole story of doubting Thomas and find whether he did worse than the others or whether you do better. The whole secret in the matter is this: Thomas was gone when the Lord appeared. All had doubted the stories that had been told about the resurrection of Jesus.

They, no doubt, reasoned on this order: The women were led by Mary Magdalene. Christ had cast seven devils out of her and she probably was telling fancied stories to shield her past. Peter and John were the men and Peter had been quilty of "cussing" and a preacher that would lie and "cuss" just couldn't be trusted. He was no doubt pulling a few tricks to get

back into the leadership of the people. Then John was such a bosom friend to Jesus that he would do anything to shield a fallen prophet." They had lost sight of Christ and were looking at the faults of the disciples. I fear this is too true of the world and even the church today. Thomas just took out, and didn't come. The Lord appeared, and showed them marvelous things, assured peace to them, empowered them to forgive each other, commissioned them to 'go' and breathed the Holy Spirit on them. Then were the disciples glad when they saw the Lord.

Thomas missed the blessing He failed to get the revival the others got. They went after Thomas and told him what happened. Thomas began finding fault. "Unless, etc... I will not believe" How sad! It wasn't the weak disciples he was taking out on, but the Lord Himself. Occasionally a member will get OFF and POUT, and tell the minister, "I'm through until, etc., ETC." It is good to let such see sometimes that Jesus can get along without them. When Jesus appeared He offered Thomas all the proof he wanted, but He gave him a sharp rebuke. This

was what Thomas needed. He proclaimed "My Lord and my God" If you have been staying at home and finding fault, try going out to meet the Lord and see what difference it makes.
