Dear Bro. Carter:

We are sending you our warmest Christian greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ from Hiroshima, Japan.

We were glad to hear from you there in Toledo, and to know your Bethel Missionary Baptist Church had voted to send the missionary offering to us in order for us to do the missionary work here in Japan. We truly thank God for each of your offerings. Your money, the check in the amount of \$48.20, will be used in the Lord's business, especially in spreading the gospel of Christ to those who have never heard and are lost in sin without hope . . . We were so happy to hear from you.

Last week I went to Murogumi, Hakari, about eighty miles south from Hiroshima (Continued on page 3)

The first service we had one man, his wife and three children came, and then the last service these same ones came and another young couple with them. The girl, whom we met on the ship that I wrote about before, promised to come, but she didn't show up. We still hope to get her coming, however; and we do earnestly request your prayers for her salvation. The others who attend are saved people.

Brother Billy Moran, pastor of Grace Baptist Church, Detroit was in Jerusalem on a tour a few days ago, and he visited us for a short time. This was truly a treat to us; we were so glad to see him, but the visit was so short. When any of you are coming here on tours be sure to visit us and stay as long as you can.

The situation in this country gets worse and worse. It seems very clear to me that conditions are shaping up for that great day of the Lord, spoken of in Zecharish 14:1-2, when all nations will come against Jerusalem to battle. What a dreadful time this is going to be! As Brother F. R. Bingham wrote to me, "That is a wonderful place to be in these last days, but also a dreadful place to be." Anyway, it is coming, and isn't it wonderful to be made ready through the shed blood of Jesus!

May the Lord's blessings rest upon all.

# The National Council of Churches

In the April, 1970 issue of the BAPTIST BANNER, the entire fourth page was used to republish an article by Mr. Tom Anderson, "Straight Talk," from the Kentucky Farmer. A free copy will be mailed to any person who will write to me and asking for one.

In the April issue of Christian Herald, an article appeared, "Good-Bye To The National Council." I quote here some statements from that article. "Founded in Cleveland, Ohio, on November 29, 1950, the NCC is now in its twentieth year. Its health is so feeble that many observers question whether it will live to celebrate its twenty-first birthday."

When one reads the record produced by Mr. Anderson, knowing the purpose of the NCC is ungodly instead of Godly true born-again children of God and true Baptists can be thankful for its failure. Recently I received a letter from Washington, D.C., signed by Sen. George McGovern asking for financial support of the NCC Instead of sending an offering, I mailed him a copy of the BAPTIST BANNER carrying the article on the ungodly activities of the NCC and the liberal and unscriptural views of so-called ministers who were taking part in it.

Another statement from the Christian Herald, "Although the NCC has consistently sided with black people, young people, war resisters and social reformers, it has not achieved great popularity among them, either. It has been too radical to suit conservatives, and too conservative to suit the radicals." This goes to teach that you cannot win people by compromising with them. The only way people can be free, is to be free from sin; the only way they can be free from sin is to know the truth. Jesus said, "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." (John 8:32). So, when Conventions, Associations,

So, when Conventions, Associations, Councils or any organization is working to get everything, everybody, any doctrine or idea to all come together, you have compromising and compromising until all you have left is a big mess of activities that are detrimental to the cause of a just and living God.

Let these who have the truth and believe in being born again by the Spirit and power of God, believe in a know-so salvation, who believe in contending for the faith once delivered to the saints which millions of Baptists have died for continue to believe the Word of God, preach it, teach it, practice it until our lives shall end and then go home to meet the Lord who died to save us and commanded us to preach the truth. The Bible teaches us that no price is too high to pay for the truth and that there should never be a price large enough to buy it, "Buy the truth, and sell it not." (Pro. 23:23a).

#### THE CROSSROADS

I believe that sound, true Baptists people in America are standing at the crossroads. We can take the great and wonderful opportunities which God has given us for granted, sit down with a "itdoesn't-make-any-difference" attitude because the world is gone anyway; or, we can ask God for grace, grit and faith and then be willing to get out of our shell and state of complacency, take our stand for God and still see a great work done in the salvation of lost souls and strengthening of His cause.

I believe the Apostle Paul has said it well enough and we should heed it today. He told the church at Ephesus, "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

"Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness; And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked.

"And take the helmet of salvation, and

to preach the word of God at a small Mission house there. A few Christians there asked me (to) come to encourage them. They were discouraged because of hard work in stony ground and opposition by heathern people for years.

When they saw nine people — young and old, men and women — get saved and made a public profession of faith in Christ, they filled with joy and made themselves rededicated to the Saviour in order to be used as soul winners. That was wonderful for them and for me. They learned how to pray for power of God. Lord used me as His method to them and I obeyed Him humbly.

This week I am planning to go north to still another sea coast — Japan Sea Coast — with my family to visit villages and towns in the mountains and on the sea coast with Christian literature, tracts 'that') tell them the way of salvation, or we can have street services by the way side or in the market places.
