The first time I ever saw Bro. Calvin Gregory was at Siloam Baptist Church, where Bro. A. J. Sloan gave out an appointment for him to preach in the early 20's. He was the loudest speaker I have ever heard. He had a very strong voice. He was saved when a young man at Mace's Hill in the Brush Arbor meeting held by, I believe, Eld. Ernest Corum from Riddleton and united with Mt. Tabor Baptist Church in October 1909. He was baptized by R. B. Davis.

God called Bro. Calvin Gregory to preach and he was ordained to full work of the ministry, December 1912. He was a mail carrier and drove a horse and buggy but gave up that job which would have made him a living and devoted his time to preaching the gospel.

Bro. Gregory had a wonderful memory, in fact, the best I ever saw. He could quote chapter after chapter, and give dates on things I had never heard of. He was very bashful, he told me. He asked for an appointment at Defeated Creek to preach, and among his hearers was Jim Jones. When Jones got home his wife said, "how did the young preacher do?" Jones replied, "if he ever preaches he's got it all to do."

He first married May Gammons. She went to school where Brother Gregory taught at Old Bottom. Her English wasn't too good and after their marriage he told her if she would leave off saying a certain word he would buy her a new dress and she did. When he was in school he was at the head of the class and never had a problem he couldn't handle.


# **CALVIN GREGORY** (Continued from Page 1)

D. Henry Piper, Superintendent of Schools in Macon County, told me Bro. Gregory was the smartest man in Macon County. He had moved here and bought a interest in the Macon County Times and later bought out his partner. His children by May Gammons Gregory were Lawrence and Meddie. May became ill and Bro. Massey and Bro. Gregory carried her to Dr. Haggard in Nashville. The doctor said it was too late and told Bro. Gregory to tell his wife she didn't have long to live. Bro. Gregory would cry when he would tell me about that. Meddie told me that May called Lawrence and herself to her bedside and asked them to promise to meet her in Heaven and they did. She soon passed on.

Some time later he married Ethel Gann of Smith County. She died in child-birth and they buried mother and child in the same casket, and at that time I had no connection or very little knowledge of Bro. Gregory. I had been called to preach at that time and had seen him at the Enon Association where he had served as clerk for forty years and preached the doctorinal sermon for twenty-five years. He came to visit our home after Ethel had passed away. He told me of their

courtship and her death and also of the death of May. He said he had so much sorrow he thought he could never laugh again. Here our friendship started.

I was called to Red Hill as pastor and also Union Camp. One night he called me and ask if I would pastor Mt. Tabor. I told him I couldn't, that I was the pastor at Red Hill. He said, "Lambert, your opportunity would be much greater, and if you don't take it they will elect, so and so." I had tried to preach at Mt. Tabor filling Bro. N. C. Fuquas' appointment, so with Bro. Gregory's help and advise I said if elected I'll come. I was elected and served the church for 19 years. That's how I learned much about Calvin Gregory. About this time he married Betty Jenkins and to their union three children were born, Leonard, Charles and Sue.

Bro. Gregory helped to organize the church at Mace's Hill in August of 1917 and was their pastor for 40 years until his death. Mace's Hill called me to help Bro. Calvin Gregory in a revival meeting. I helped him in sixteen meetings. He knew English and the Bible. I told him to correct my English and he often did. So, I went to school also in our meetings, and listened to his sermons which were some of the greatest I have ever heard. I worked with him in some twenty-five meetings. He helped me at Mt. Zion near Holland, Kentucky and also helped at Mt. Tabor several times.

Our paths crossed so many times and he was always jolly and telling jokes. He loved to get one on me. I remember we were eating in Lafayette one day and I was on my way to a funeral when I took a fork to pry the top off a pint of milk and it skipped to the milk and the milk spilled on my coat and tie. He grabbed a towel and tried to clean me up and horse laughed right loud. I said of all the

millions of people in the United States you had to be the one sitting here. I soon dried up and I went on my way.

Bro. Gregory held around 3,000 funerals and after his death I held many of his funerals. I would sit in the pulpit or chair and think if Bro. Gregory were alive he would be sitting here.

Brother Gregory knew the names of many of the stars. We were out one clear night and he said, "Lambert that star yonder is so and so and named many." He carried me one day to Mutton Bluff spring. One hollow went down by Bro. Ellis Porter's and the other Dixon Creek. He knew lots about the Civil War. The soldiers at Mutton Bluff would get a sheep off of a farm and ask the farmer to come and eat. He didn't know he was eating his own sheep.

One day he said Lambert, go with me to Carthage. We went down the creek of Mimmie Gregory Hill. He would say so and so was hanged on a certain day, and he could name the group. That was one of the most pleasant days we ever spent together as he told me the history of most every field and crossroad.

He was a great debator, meeting the best the other side had to offer.

I received a very sad call about a man that had done more in 66 years than most men would do in a 100. Bro. Calvin Gregory is in the Lafayette hospital with a stroke. The call was early and I went right to the hospital. Dr. Smith said to go on in and see him but that he wouldn't know me. I went to his bedside and he was breathing hard. It was the first time he didn't say hello Lambert. I said goodbye with tears. Dr. Smith said he wouldn't live. So that day his walk and talk stopped. But today his great work still follows on.

His funeral was held in the Lafayette High School building by Bro. W. T. Russell, Bro. Paul Oldham and myself. His body sleeps in the beautiful city of the dead at Haysville, Tennessee.

we have finished a main course, they bring on some fresh figs, or fresh grapes from the vine for the dessert, that is when they are in season. Or other fruits in their season. Then the prophet mentions the olive, if it fails, What? Olives are another important item for people in the East. They are eaten, of course, and the oil pressed from the olive was used to mix with other foods, and in Biblical days they used the oil for fuel, to burn in their oil lamps. And the prophet goes on: "And the fields yield no meat" No grain for bread, a basic food, and no vegetables for the table; Further he says, "The flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stall. He has included all kinds of food that people eat, and other essentials to life at the time. If all these essentials to life fail: no food. and the children crying for bread, how about it then? Well, that great prophet and servant of the Lord, Habakkuk said, "Yet I will rejoice in the Lord; I will joy in the God of my salvation" This reminds us of what Paul said in Romans 5:2, 3: He says in verse 2, that we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. But then he says: "And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also" Listen, Only a truly born again child of God can rejoice in circumstances as mentioned above. Superficial professors, many of them, would turn and curse God if He were to take away what they have.

Many of God's people are enjoying more of the material blessings today than ever before, especially in the United States, but less people are experiencing joy in the Lord. Usually worldly goods and the care about them crowds the Word of God clear out of our thinking, and when this happens we can't expect to have much joy from our salvation. There are more Bibles today than ever before, but the most of them are just dust catchers. People just don't pick them up, open them and see what great Words are on the inside. We must feed our souls on God's precious Word, or we will have a lean soul, and not much joy. Joy comes by obedience, but how can we obey if we don't know what God has said? But somebody says, I let the Spirit lead; yes, but how are you going to know which spirit is leading if you have no knowledge of God's teaching from His Word? The Holy Spirit leads in accordance with His Divine Truth, not contrary to it.

It is a little strange, but true, that people in the same household will have such different views about spiritual things. One son, or one daughter, may have deep interest about what God has to

say, and then another one will be only concerned about Worldly goods and the pleasure of them. Martha and Mary were sisters, and Jesus, our Lord, came to visit them; Mary sat at the feet of Jesus and heard His gracious Words, Luke 10:39; She fed her soul on the Words that fell from the Master's lips; Jesus said in another place, "Blessed are they that hear the Word of God, and keep it." Luke 11:28; But Martha, Mary's sister, had other views from her sister. She was concerned about serving her guest, and she wanted Mary to get up from hearing the Words of the Master and help her serve. Jesus lovingly rebuked Martha for this, "Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things; but one thing is needful; and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her." Luke 10:41-42. Martha was busy, she wasn't lazy, but she was more concerned about many things than she was about feasting on the Word of God. Things have to be done around the house, and in other places, but putting everything else before the Lord, and His Word and Work, is the thing that is starving souls today; Maybe God will have to take it all away from us, as he did in the days of ancient Israel and His servant Habakkuk; but on the other hand, even if God were to destroy what material goods we have, maybe by a nuclear war, how many left would be able to look out and see the destitution, the fields burned over, the fruit orchards withered away, the livestock all killed, famine on a full scale, and rejoice in the Lord?

Where is your heart? The Bible answer to this question is, it is where your treasure is (Matthew 6:21) If your heart is set on the world, then down here is where your treasures are, you haven't laid up any in heaven; and how can you expect to rejoice in the Lord? There are so many worldly Christians today that the world out there cannot distinguish them from sinners. They would like to have joy in the Lord, but the price is too high. Poor lean souls! You have to do things around the house on the Lord's day, or you have got to go visiting on Sunday, or you think that Sunday is the only day to relax and have some recreation, church can be left to the others. Poor lean soul! You talk of your troubles, and you think you are having it harder than anybody. Whose fault is it? Is it God's? Or is all my ills somebody else's fault? Or, would you be humble enough to say it is my own backslidings; I haven't been faithful to my Lord; so I am dried up on the stalk. But there is hope. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and
