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REDEEMED BY THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF CHRIST

"Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish, and without spot." I Peter 1:18, 19

Redemption means, primarily, to get back, or buy back out of slavery; by paying a ransom price. Certainly the apostle is writing about a price paid, but the price is not silver and gold. Something more precious and of a higher value than earthy goods, Christ Himself and His precious blood. Three times the apostle in this first chapter writes about corruptible and incorruptible things. Silver and gold, corruptible things; Verse three: he writes about our inheritance, incorruptible and undefiled; in verse twentythree, about the new birth, Being born again, not of corruptible need, but incorruptible need by the Word of God. What God does and what He gives in incorruptible and undefiled; and He doesn't accept anything less than pure as an offering for sin. That's why He had to offer His only begotten Son to redeem us from corruption.

MAN A SLAVE TO SIN AND SATAN

Satan is the god of this world, and the prince and power of the air. Ephesians 2:2 and 2:12. Satan has power, power to hold captives, hold them in a snare. See II Timothy 2:24-26. Sinners are in such bandage and a captive to sin and Satan, and ensnared, that he can't deliver himself. The more he tries to get out of his predicament, the deeper he gets in, like somebody in quicksand. If he tries to get one foot out, the other one goes deeper. The Israelites were in bondage in Egypt, the king of Egypt had the mastery over them, and though they were more in number than the Egyptians, they were powerless to get out of their slavery. They were delivered by the blood of a lamb. That bondage was a type of sinners in spiritual bondage to sin and Satan. It takes the blood of God's lamb, the Lord Jesus Christ to redeem and deliver. Jesus paid the ransom price for our deliverance, the deliverance that we have experienced points back to His atoning death on the old rugged cross. Nothing else would do, nothing else will God accept; it's the blood or be doomed forever. "Without the shedding of blood is no remission." Hebrews 9:22. "How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God." Hebrews 9:14.

There are people, who even call themselves Christians that try to take out of Scripture such fundamental doctrines as the virgin birth of Christ, and the atoning blood of Christ; but if these could be taken out there would be no plan for our salvation. God promised His Son as a gift, and a child born, born of a virgin; "For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government shall be upon His shoulders and His name shall be called wonderful, Counselor, The Mighty God; the everlasting Father, The Prince of peace." This gift of God, the child born, was born of a virgin; "Behold a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel" Isaiah 9:6; 7:14. He was God with us, this is the meaning of the word Immanuel. He was God manifested in human form; He had to be in the form of man to suffer and shed His blood to redeem us from sin and death. "Blessed Redeemer, Jesus is mine, Oh, what a foretaste of glory devine, I'm an heir of salvation, the purchase of God, I'm born of the Spirit, washed in His blood" "In whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins,

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Elder Howard G. Taylor passed away, November 19, 1988 at the age of 67 after a long illness.

At the time of his death, Bro. Taylor was the Pastor of McFerrin Baptist Church, having served in that capacity since January 1974.

Bro. Taylor was born in Trousdale County, Tenn. on March 23, 1921 the son of Gilbert and Mary Nunley Taylor.

He is survived by his wife, Juanita, daughter Sarah, two brothers, and two sisters.

Bro. Taylor was converted at Good Will Baptist Church in 1932, and was baptized into the fellowship of that body by Elder Calvin Gregory.

While a young man, he was called into the field of labor by the Lord, and wsa ordained to the full work of the ministry on December 29, 1946 by Good Will Baptist Church.

His first pastorage was at Bethel Baptist Church in Indianapolis, Ind. from November 1946-September 1953. He later served as pastor of the following churches: Antioch, Macon County, Tenn., Plano, Warren County, Ky., East Main Street, Hartsville, Tenn., Faith Baptist Church, Bowling Green, Ky., Faith Baptist Church, Nashville, Tenn., and McFerrin Baptist Church, Nashville, Tenn.

Bro. Taylor was a well known Baptist minister and had preached for the Siloam Baptist Association. He was very active in the Wiseman Baptist Association, having delivered the memorial sermon for several years. He had also served as the assistant moderator for several years, and had been the Moderator for the past ten years.

Bro. Taylor's greatest loves in life were his Church and his family. He wsa completing fifteen years as pastor of McFerrin Baptist church, and after he was diagnosed as terminally ill, his

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

desire was to continue to serve his Lord and his Church as Pastor until his death. Although he was grievously ill, the Lord granted his wish, and he was able to preach each Sunday at McFerrin until two weeks before his death.

During this time of illness, he was a constant source of courage and strength to his family and friends, in that he continued to live his life as normal as possible, and continued to minister to his Church. His faith in and love for the Lord never wavered, and he approached death with the sure knowledge that Heaven was waiting him on the other side.

Bro. Taylor's life was cut short by this illness. We do not understand all of God's decisions, but we do know he makes no mistakes. His works will continue to bear fruit for the Lord, even though his earthly ministry is over. May we all take courage from his example, and strive to live our lives in such a manner as to glorify the Father in heaven.

according to the riches of His grace." Ephesians 1:7. Those who claim to be Christians and deny the blood, are not heirs of God's salvation, that's for sure!

BLOOD MUST BE APPLIED

When God was about to deliver His people, the children of Israel, from Egypt, He told Moses to command the people to take a lamb for each household on the tenth day of the month, and keep it up till the fourteenth day, and then kill it in the evening, "And they shall take of the blood, and strike it on the two side posts, and upon the upper door post; "And the blood shall be to you for a token upon your houses where ye are; and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt." Exodus 12: 1-13. The blood had to be applied to the door post, that is where the destroying angel looked for the blood. The blood had been shed, and the blood was sufficient for their deliverance, but had to be applied, or it wouldn't have benefited them.

FORGIVENESS OF SINS

Man is a sinner and stands guilty before God, and His holy law; and for God to be just and true to His Law, He must deal with sin; He will not just ignore it. The way He deals with sin is through the preaching of His Word and the work of the Holy Spirit. And when the sinner is brought to repentance by these means God forgives. But in forgiving God remembers the atoning death of His Son on the cross. He doesn't forgive on the basis of any merits on the sinner's part. Note this verse: "In whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace." Ephesians 1:7 Notice the order of this verse: Redemption, forgiveness, through the blood, and according to the riches of His grace. God does forgive, but He does so on the merits of His Son, His shed blood, and it is His grace, His loving favor; the sinner is not worthy of it.

DELIVERANCE

The sinner isn't only in bondage to sin and Satan, he is under the sentence of death; but the Bible tells us of the believer passing from death unto life, "Verily verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on Him that sent me hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation, but is passed from death unto life." John 5:24. The Psalmist said, "For Thou hast delivered my soul from death." Psalm 116:8. Again I refer to the Israelites in Egypt and how they were delivered; they were delivered by the blood. "For the Lord will pass through to smite the Egyptians; and when He useth the blood and nothing else. God commanded them to keep a feast of unleanened bread, but this was for a memorial, to commemorate their deliverance by

the blood of the lamb. We observe the Lord's supper to remember the Lord's suffering and His shed blood, but this isn't to save us, or help to save us, it is a memorial, painting to Calvary where God's Lamb shed His blood that taketh away the sin of the world. "What can wash away my sins, nothing but the blood of Jesus. What a great and comforting thought it is to know that we are safe and secure under the blood!
